Funding received: £8000 plus £5 per pupils aged 5-11 years old = Total £9145

Background:

The Government have provided funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport to schools. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. The funding is for the period 1 September 2015 – 31 August 2016. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make a sustainable impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

During the academic year September 2015 to August 2016 we plan to spend our funding in the following areas:

- Comprehensive package purchased from the Hunts School Sports Partnership* (£4000)
- Training for 2 NQT teachers in content, delivery and expectations of the new curriculums (£600)
- Training of teachers and other school staff across a range of sports and sporting activities (£1000)
- Fund Sports coaches from assessed outside providers for extracurricular activities (£500)
- Purchase New PE Scheme of Work (£295)
- PE Coordinator and Sports Coach monitoring and assessment activities (£300)
- Purchase of addition resources to support physical education in school (£1000)
- Further the use of intra school Competitions throughout KS1 and KS2 to enhance competition opportunities.(£200)
- Purchase of equipment and trophies/medals to enhance interest in competitions (£100)
- Provide transport to sports competitions/festivals events throughout the school year (£850)
- Hire of pool and organisation of Swimming Galas (£300)
