The Year 5 maths team, Ben, Olivia, Thomas and Imogen, came top of the leader board in the local rounds to reach the regional finals which were held at the Duxford Air Museum. They were all able to demonstrate their deep understanding of maths, their amazing recall of number facts and their great sense of team work.

School Development -

Following our positive Ofsted, the school has had another successful year. We are expecting similar end of year results to last year as shown by the provisional data, with good progress for children at the end of Year 6 and EYFS. The provisional results for reading at Year 6 were bitter sweet at 73% achieving age expectation - 4% lower than last year at but with 31% of Year 6 achieving greater depth in reading. Writing and Maths results are 2% higher than the provision national scores for Age Expectation at 80% & 78% respectively. However we are asking for 3 - 4 maths papers to be remarked which may alter final results.

Both maths and writing results in KS1 were higher than the previous year but again the results for reading at 70%, were disappointing. EYFS children had a particularly successful year with 76% of children achieving GLD [good level of development] which is a 6% increase on 2017 data. Moving forward to the next year, reading will be a focus in all year groups so it will be important for children to record all their reading in their reading diaries. Greater depth in writing and maths will also be a key focus area along with the continuation to embed spelling strategies which is a county wide issue. The social and emotional aspects of learning will be another targeted area next year, to ensure all children, particularly boys, are ready to learn when they arrive at school each day.



THE YOUNG UN'S visit Warboys

The Radio 2 award winning folk band The Young Un's, worked with key stage two to support our work on the importance of values, especially British Values. In between singing their own folk songs, Sean, Paul and Michael, engaged the children in drama to tell stories, helped the children write and recite raps and inspired them to always have ambition. In the whole school assembly the Young Un's sang topical songs, and told the history of the Wind Rush and the development of the well known M&S store.

Our Attendance Challenge of 96% was successful again! Well done to 38 children who received the new 'Platinum' attendance certificates for 100% attendance for 3 terms. On top of this 148 children achieved their gold award for the summer. This was another great achievement for the majority of children.

Attendance was slightly down on last years figures but we still achieved our goal of over 96%. So well done everyone.

Sadly, the Local Authority again issued several fines for non attendance and in term time holidays. To help prevent any further fines being issued we will continue working with families to improve attendance and punctuality. We will be turning our attention to reduce the number of children being late for registration and missing the first part of the morning session.

Register call is at 8.45am and the first lesson starts at 8.55.

FOOD FOR LIFE Bronze Award



After 14 months of hard work, we were awarded the Food for Life Bronze Award for our healthy and climate-friendly food culture.



As part of the Bronze Award Scheme, we serve seasonal school meals, 75% of which are freshly prepared by experienced school cook, Shari. Most pupils have had the opportunity to visit a farm, cook and participate in food growing activities during their time at school, and pupils and parents have been involved in making improvements to the school's menu and dining experience. Mr

Duncan, as the DT Leader, Mrs Boxall, Thomas and Imogen were invited to The Maltings, Ely for the celebration ceremony to receive our award. We arrived for a breakfast of, fruit, muffins, bread and dips - which was a lovely surprise. About 20 other schools had assembled in the hall and were carefully grouped, we were group 3.

Our first activity was Farmers Market and we guessed how many pea pods were in a jar and how much a watermelon weighed (Mr Duncan won it). We went on to plant some seeds in a small tub and made a seed gift set. We used our handprints to make prints of

fruits and used these to design a bag each. These were good ideas to bring back to school.

After that, we entered the science lab which Professor H.E.Althy taught. He did some really cool tricks with water. He filled up a bottle of water and put cardboard under it. It was meant not to spill but because his hands were shaky it all spilled. He drew an arrow on paper and showed it behind a bottle of water, amazingly the arrow appeared the other way round. Then he made sparks in a



candle flame using the **limonene** from orange pith – that was really cool! Professor Althy chose two teachers to come up to make sure he didn't fall whilst he stood on eggs! He then did a trick with chocolate where he had a full bar and cut a third of it off and cut of a single piece, but when he put it all back together, we had a full bar and 1 piece left over. Our third activity was letter press printing. We picked out all the letters to spell our favourite food or fruit. We had to put them in order but back to front, I made the word grapes and Imogen made melon, then we made the word Warboys. Once the letters for our chosen word were in the right place we had to roller paint it in red, black or green. It was then lunch time. Being food for Life it was obviously a healthy lunch. Following on from the school's success in achieving 'Good' at our last Ofsted inspection, the Governing Body have been working hard to make sure that we do not sit on our laurels but improve further towards the goal of achieving 'Outstanding' at our next Ofsted.

The Governing Body believes that the best way forward now is for the school to join a Multi Academy Trust. For the last eighteen months we have been investigating and exploring the feasibility of joining a trust and not just the benefits that would bring but also what would be the disadvantages. We have met with several Multi Academy Trusts and unanimously decided that the best and most suitable trust for Warboys would be The Thomas Deacon Education Trust, which is a Peterborough based Trust, we are however still in a consultation period with parents and staff.

Every Governor has their own area of responsibility within the school based on the School Development Plan. Each Governor has made several visits to the school in the last term and I am pleased to say that the school is on track with it's plan. Unfortunately, after 8 years as a school governor, Nigel Graham is leaving the Governing Body, I would like to take this opportunity to say a huge thank you to Nigel for the many hours and contributions to the Governing Body that he has given over the years he has served as a co-opted Governor. We are very fortunate that we have already had two applications for vacant positions in September. This will once again give the Governing Body a full membership, something that is the envy of other schools, but is a true reflection on how well the school is performing and moving forward.
