## Warboys Community Primary School Sport Premium Funding 2016/17

Current numbers on roll = 256

Number of children in Reception and years 1 – 6 who are eligible for Sport Premium on the January 2016 School Census = 221

Funding received: £8000 plus £5 per pupils aged 5-11 years old = Total £9105

## Background:

The Government have provided funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport to schools. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. The funding is for the period September 2016 – 31 August 2017. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make a sustainable impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

## During the academic year September 2016 to August 2017 we plan to spend our funding in the following areas:

- Comprehensive package purchased from the Hunts School Sports Partnership\* (£4000)
- Engraving of plaques with new school records (£350)
- Training of teachers and other school staff across a range of sports and sporting activities (£1000)
- Fund Sports coaches from assessed outside providers for extracurricular activities (£500)
- Repair broken trim trail on KS2 playground (£470)
- PE Coordinator and Sports Coach monitoring and assessment activities (£300)
- Purchase of addition resources to support physical education in school (£1000)
- Further the use of intra school Competitions throughout KS1 and KS2 to enhance competition opportunities (£175)
- Focus on Swimming, Hire of pool and swimming coach (£200)
- Provide transport to sports competitions/festivals events throughout the school year (£850)
- Hire of pool and organisation of Swimming Galas (£260)

\*The Hunts School Sports Partnership (HSSP) is a 'not for profit' organisation based at Hinchingbrooke School. The experienced and highly qualified team works closely with schools across Huntingdonshire to support them in raising whole school standards in Physical Education and School Sport.
