
A huge WELL DONE to all our sports teams for playing brilliantly in their matches this term.

We had a fabulous time on World Book Day and there were so many amazing costumes.


The children all enjoyed taking part in lots of literary activities. Thank you to everyone for your support and for making it a day to remember!



At the end of this term we have been reading Jasper's Beanstalk, discussing what is needed for plants to grow and are growing our very own Sunflower!




We LOVED World Book day and coming dressed up as our favourite character! We also were excited to have two very special guests come and read us a story!

We had great fun dressing up for World book day! Don't you think Mrs Smith and Mrs Howlett look amazing too!




We have worked collaboratively to create artwork using a range of media. We were inspired by Debussy's La Mer and artwork by Zaria Forman.

For British science week we looked at camouflage. We designed moths and hid them outside.








In art we have been exploring using equipment to draw textures and feelings..

I loved reading to the different adults at school and sharing my book









"En mi casa hay un garaje." (In my house there is a garage.)






Buddhist prayer flags. We are going to hang them in the Y5&6 cloakroom.
