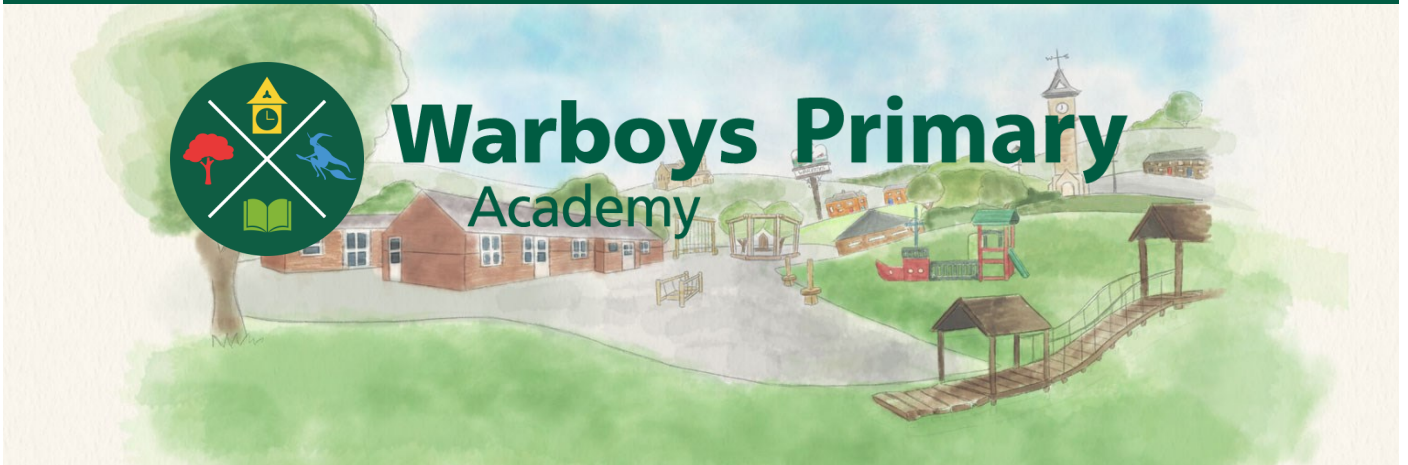
## Congratulations to all our sports teams!



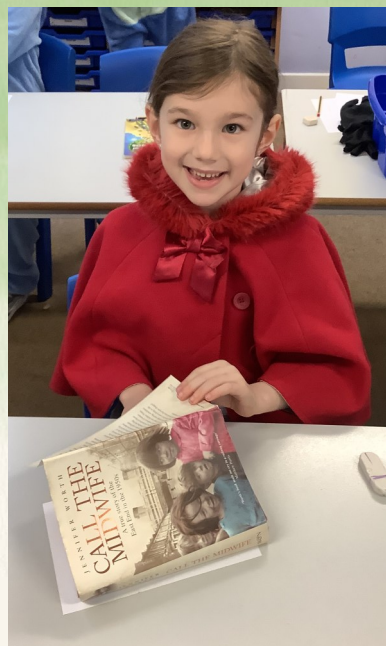
A huge WELL DONE to all our sports teams for playing brilliantly in their matches this term.

Thank to you all our parents/ carers for your support and to our staff members who spend so much time training them. Great work everyone!

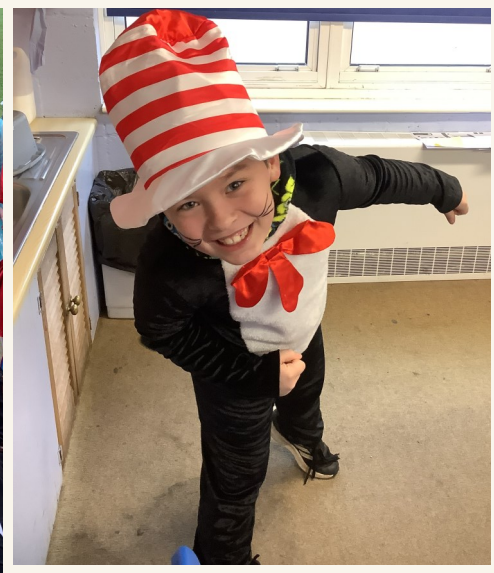


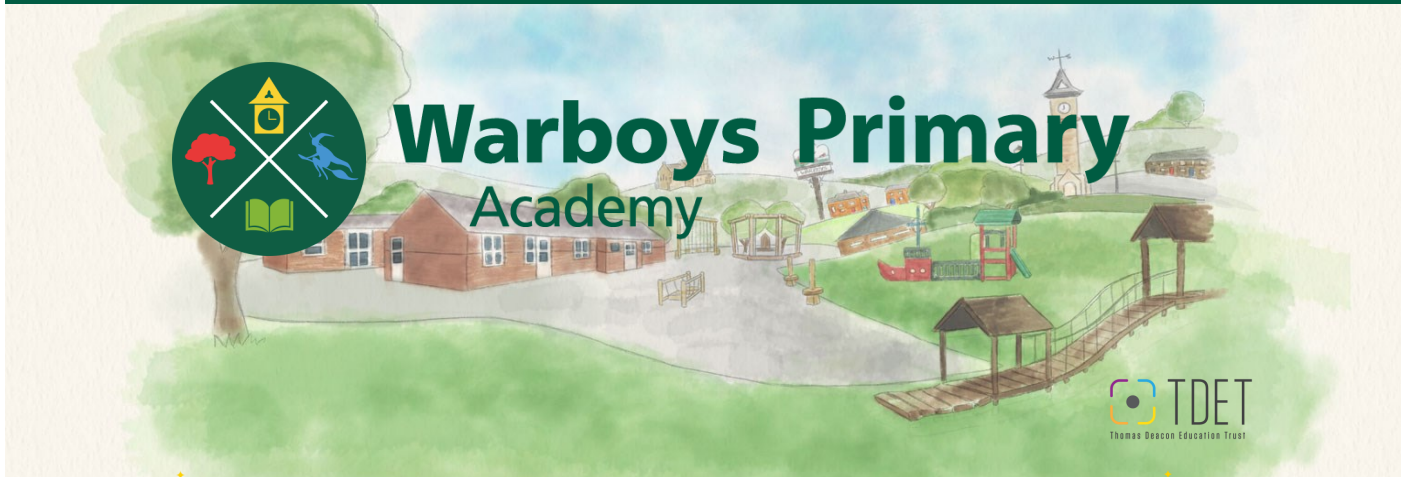
## Fun on World Book Day!

We have really enjoyed playing on the new Early Years playground.

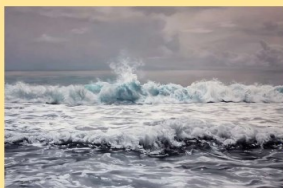
## Seahorses Class 2023 - 2024



We had great fun dressing up for World book day! Don't you think Mrs Smith and Mrs Howlett look amazing too!



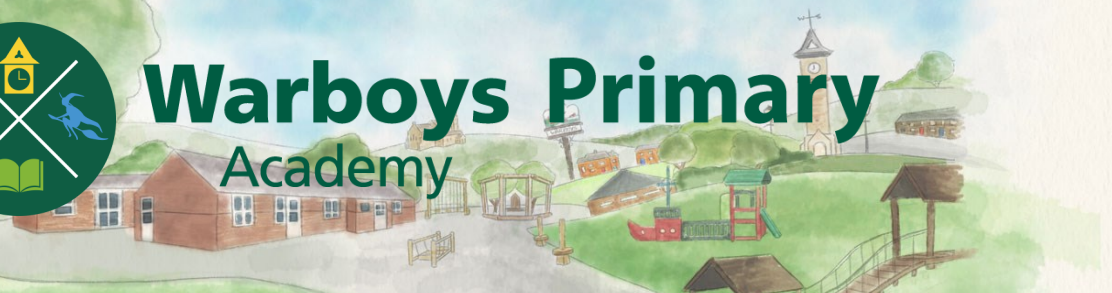
We have worked collaboratively to create artwork using a range of media. We were inspired by Debussy's La Mer and artwork by Zaria Forman.

In art, we have been looking at different artists and creating our own pieces based on their work. We used a range of resources to experiment with the effects they created.

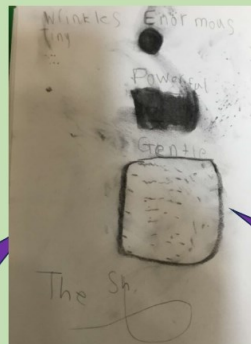
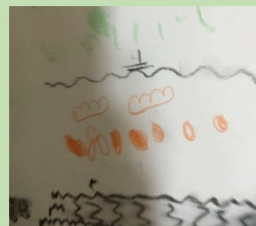

For British science week we looked at camouflage. We designed moths and hid them outside.

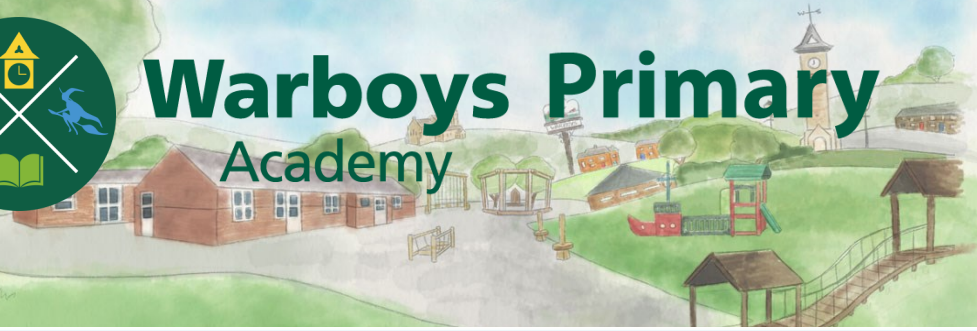


In art we have been exploring using equipment to draw textures and feelings.
