Current numbers on roll = 315

Number of children in Reception and years 1 – 6 who are **eligible** for Sport Premium on the October 2023 School Census = **298**

Funding received: £18,625 (excluding sugar tax) £18,710 (298 including sugar tax, plus £5 per pupils aged 5-11 years old)

Background:

The Government have provided funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport to schools. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. The funding is for the period 1 September 2024 – 31 August 2025. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make a sustainable impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

During the academic year September 2024 to August 2025 we plan to spend our funding in the following areas:

- Comprehensive package purchased from the Hunts School Sports Partnership*
- Training of teachers and other school staff across a range of sports and sporting activities
- Development of Lunchtime provision
- Renewal of scheme of work to improve teacher's confidence and improve quality of lessons.
- Purchase of replacement/new resources to support physical education in school.
- Provide transport to sports competitions/festivals events throughout the school year.
- Subsidised Sports Clubs to enable 2 hours+ a week of sporting activity.
